## 'THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK'

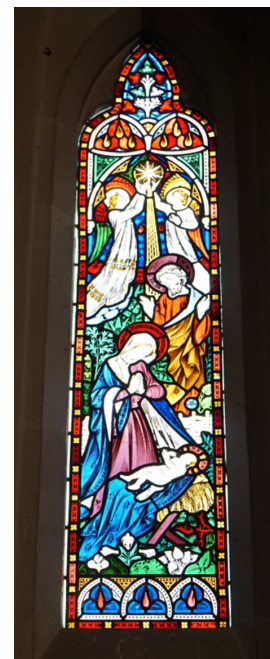

We can still celebrate and give thanks for the wonderful mystery of the Incarnation - God taking on human flesh as a vulnerable baby in a backwater of the Roman Empire. The poem by Ann Weems, which was included in our November / December newsletter, seems to me particularly appropriate this year and so I am repeating it here.
